


To those who are residents of Mississippi, thank you for keeping our traditional state flag from being changed.

Obituary: David George Hazlewood

From the Enterprise-Journal, McComb, MS, March 2, 2001 edition:

David G. Hazlewood, 69, of the Thompson community in Amite County, died March 1, 2001, at his residence. Visitation is 5-9 tonight at Hartman Funeral Home of McComb. Visitation continues at 9 a.m. Saturday at First Baptist Church in Summit, until services there at 10 a.m. Dr. Jerry Smith and the Rev. Jay Victory will officiate. Burial will be in Thompson Baptist Church Cemetery in Smithdale.

Mr. Hazlewood was born Oct. 7, 1931, in Centreville. He was the son of the late George T. Hazlewood and Wilhelmena Bryant Hazlewood.

He was a self-employed building contractor, and a member of First Baptist Church of Summit. He was a veteran of the U.S. Air Force, and served during the Korean Conflict.

Survivors include his wife, Shirley Jones Hazlewood of Thompson; one daughter, Connie Settle of Baton Rouge, La.; one sister and brother-in-law, Oleta and Sidney Lundy of Opelousas, La.; and one grandson, Marshall Settle of Baton Rouge.

Pallbearers will be John Paulk, Gus Paulk, Pat Dominick, Brad Bean, Charles Warren, Jarred Garner, Harry Wells and Earl Gay Edwards. Honorary pallbearers will be Jack Gatlin, Mike Barron, Matt Tircuitt, Jim Reeves and Vester Newcomb.



Did anybody join the Sons of Confederate Veterans?

Reunion?

In the first issue I asked several questions regarding interest in a family reunion. Here's what I heard from those who responded:

Are you interested in attending a Bryant family reunion? Everyone that responded said "yes"

... would the location affect your ability or willingness to attend? The most distant from Mississippi did not respond to this question. Those that did respond did not indicate having a problem with location.

Do have alternative site suggestions? The suggestions I received were all in SW Mississippi. DG Hazlewood suggested Percy Quin State Park because they have facilities designed for such activities. **Janice Bryant Bonnecaze** suggested either Ebenezer Church (south Amite County, near LA state line) or Brushy Creek Guest Ranch (several miles north of Gloster in Homochitto National Forest). **Betty Bryant** echoed the Brushy Creek site because it has been the venue for the Dominick family reunion.

What would be the best time of year for you? Only a couple of people addressed this; they prefer cooler months. Since we're about past the spring, a reunion this year would have to be in October or November.

Would you be willing to pay . . .? If so, how much . . .? No one put a dollar figure on this but several indicated they would be willing to contribute at least a small amount.

Do you know anyone, kin or otherwise, that would have an inside-track to a meeting place suitable for a reunion? Janice Bonnecaze has connections via the Dominick family to likely get the Ebenezer Church facilities.

My thoughts:

From my communications with an SCV member in Liberty I have learned that the "Legion Hut" on Hwy. 24 west of Liberty has been renovated since my days in the area and is now used for meeting functions. This was originally built by the American Legion; I'm not sure if they still own it or not. Cost for this should be very reasonable. I'm willing to move on firming up plans to meet in October or November but I need your thoughts and preferences so I can see what the majority of possible attendees prefer. Please let me know by mail or e-mail so I can start a file on reunion plans. Thanks.

The number of family responding to the first newsletter exceeded my expectations. I heard from cousins I have never met and from several that I have not seen in over thirty years. I was a bit disappointed that I got no response from any of the **Tyrus** and **Sallie Cobb** cousins. I had hoped to get genealogical information on the Tyrus Cobb family from them.

I was surprised by the number of family members who are "on the 'net." Most of us are over fifty and I didn't expect so many "oldsters" to use e-mail but I'm glad you do because I find it the quickest way to communicate without running up telephone bills.
